Dear Parent/Guardian,

As the summer break approaches I know many of you will be getting things in place, ready for September. There are some important areas of focus that will be a high priority when the new school year begins.

Uniform

When we return in September it is expected that students will have the highest standards of uniform. In particular, some areas of concern include the following:

- Trainers and canvas pumps (converse style trainers) are not appropriate for school. Students should be wearing formal shoes.
- Facial piercings are not allowed in school.
- Hoodies are not allowed in school.
- Hair colours need to be natural.
- Fake tan, false eyelashes and nail extensions need to be removed before students return.
- Skirts must be knee length, black pleated skirts.

In the Autumn term regular checks will be completed and a zero-tolerance approach will be taken in regard to uniform. Equipment

In the Autumn Term, students will be expected to have the correct equipment when they return. Students are required to have the following items for school; black/blue pen, green pen, purple pen, pencil, ruler, whiteboard (pen and wiper), scientific calculator and their school bag. The school stationery shop has a number of these items available to order. We will also be opening the stationery shop again in school twice a week to enable students to top up their items. It would be helpful if students could check they have all the items in the list above before they return to school.

If you require support with providing students with the required equipment or uniform outlined in the parental handbook, please do not hesitate to contact your child's Year Leader.

Bus Travel

Whilst there have been many successes and areas for celebration this academic year as the school returns to normal after the pandemic, one area in which there has been consistent challenges has been the use of the bus services by students travelling to and from school. There have been a number of complaints about student behaviour on the bus services, both by Stagecoach and by members of the public.

If your child chooses to use public transport to travel to and from school, please can you talk to him/her about what is expected. Poor behaviour on the bus service in particular, but also in the wider community when a child is wearing their uniform, it will be dealt with swiftly and in a rigorous manner. Stagecoach will ban students from travelling who persistently disrupt the service.

If your child loses their ticket or cannot access it on their mobile phone, Stagecoach can refuse travel. There have been an increasing number of students who have lost their ticket, or cannot access the ticket on their phone. Students need to ensure their ticket is kept safe and secure.
