At KS3, our students start with Spanish and then start to learn French after February half-term.

Implementation

Key Stage 3

Our aim is to develop communicative competence in CHS students, engaging them in pragmatic, functional use whilst gaining an understanding and appreciation of different cultures in Spain, France and the Spanish- and French-speaking world.

The topics also feed into the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR), widely accepted as the European standard for grading an individual's language proficiency.

Assessment

GCSE French and Spanish have a Foundation Tier (grades 1–5) and a Higher Tier (grades 4–9). Students must take all four question papers at the same tier. All question papers must be taken in the same series.

Students will be assessed at regular intervals throughout their course using key knowledge tests, sample exam questions and past papers from the exam board. Students are given regular and detail feedback allowing them to reflect on their strengths and the steps needed to progress further.
