

#### **Results Round-Up!**

U13 football tournament hosted by Morecambe Football Club. The U13 girls football team were outstanding in the tournament against 10 local secondary schools. The team were a mix of both year 7 and 8 players, so they have not played together before. Considering this the team were both encouraging and positive during their games.

The team played 4 games, lost one and won three. This left us with 10 pts drawing with OLCC. The result went on goal difference and unfortunately OLCC had scored one more goal than us. The team came joint second in their group and left the tournament with a medal. A massive well done to all the players with a standout performance from Faith who scored an unbelievable goal against Central. Also, Lacey was an outstanding captain and organised player positions and played brilliantly herself. Well done team!

The year 7 boys brought two handball teams to the district handball tournament at Our Lady's. The B team won the tournament drawing one game (against CHS B) and winning the three other games. The first game was a 1-1 draw between CHS A and CHS B. Joe the scorer for CHS A and Jack the scorer for CHS B. The A team then won the following three fixtures, a 1-0 win over Morecambe Bay Academy Red, Dan with the only goal. A 2-0 win over MBA Yellow, Dan again with both goals. The final game for the team was a big 5-2 win vs OLCC – Joe and Dan scoring two a piece, Oliver with the fifth. Well done boys. The B team drew three games and won one, in a superb performance. #### **Sports Transport and Fixture Payments**

The PE department is offering the opportunity for parents to make a one-time payment at the start of the 2023/24 academic year of £25 to cover their child's extra-curricular fixture transport payments. Currently the PE department charges £1 for home fixtures and £2 for away fixtures, this covers a percentage of cost for transport and competition fees, this will remain in place for parents who do not wish to make the £25 one-time payment. We believe that this for some parents will be a preferential method of payment for their child's sporting fixtures throughout the school year.
