### **Parent Governor Vacancy**

Interested in becoming a school governor at Carnforth High School?

School governors play a vital role in education. By volunteering as a governor for a school you can make a difference by shaping the future of children and young people.

#### **Reasons to volunteer**

- Help ensure voices are heard
- A rewarding experience
- Leadership development
- Improve the lives of children and young people
- Build professional skills and networks

Governing within a school also provides an opportunity for personal development, building your skills and experience in areas such as project management, budgeting and working as part of a leadership team.

There are no specific qualifications or requirements for the role – every governing board needs a balance and diversity of knowledge, skills and experience. All those who have parental responsibility and are over the age of 18 are eligible, including parents who work at the school, provided that they work for less than 500 hours per year when they are elected. You just need to have a child at the school.

There are some circumstances that disqualify an individual from serving as a school governor. Please see the attached sheet for details. You will need to complete a self-declaration of eligibility form to state that there are no reasons for disqualification from serving as a governor.



Jacob produced the only Carnforth goal, finding the far corner of the goal from inside the box. Goalkeeper Eli was player of the match, denying the QKS attackers any further goals. The year 8s won 4-1 in a strong performance. Archie scored his first goal for school in the first half. Captain Theo scored the second and third Carnforth goal of the game, before centre forward Kenzie found the bottom corner to seal the victory. Central midfielder Blake was named player of the match. Well done boys.



## **Girls Cricket**

On Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> March we took a group down to compete in the second round of the district cricket tournament. The pupils were fantastic and worked brilliantly as a team. The competition was hard, but the girls held their own. Dolly made some excellent tactical decisions as captain. Lily bowled 3 people out in her bowling innings which was exceptional! Although we did not win the group the girls played exceptionally well and should be proud of their performance.

## **Girls Netball**

On March 6<sup>th</sup> the year 9 netballers travelled to Ripley to take part in their district netball. The girls played really well and improved throughout the tournament the more games that they played. The year 9s have been coming to training regularly and have been steadily making progress all season. There were some last-minute changes to the team and their positions due to injury and players moving school; these players were missed, but thankfully their replacements adapted to their positions excellently. Carnforth's individual results for the year 9s were that they lost 2 games against LGGS and RST A, won 2 games against Our Lady's and MBA and drew 1 game against RST B. From these results this meant that the overall standings for the tournament were as follows RST A 1<sup>st</sup>, RST b 2<sup>nd</sup>, LGGS 3<sup>rd</sup>, CHS 4<sup>th</sup>, MBA 5<sup>th</sup>, OLCC 6<sup>th</sup>. Well done to all girls that took part. Netball training will return in September.



## Years 8-10 Whistlers at Lancaster University

On 7<sup>th</sup> March the year 8 9 and 10 girls Whistlers travelled to Lancaster University to take part in a district girls Futsal competition. Futsal is a very high energy, fast paced game, with rules that mimic football, however it is played 5 a-side inside a sports hall. Our teams were made up of one 5 a-side year 8 team, one 5 a-side year 9 team and 5 referees from year 9 and 10. The girls enjoyed playing this brand-new sport, and gained confidence and new skills the more they progressed through the tournament. The year 8 girls team finished 4th overall. The year 9 girls worked tirelessly in their matches and communicated well to each other. They continued to push forward with the ball and scored 8 goals in total, all of which scored by top goal scorer Amelia, and one scored by Erin. The year 9's played 4 games in total, drawing one of these and winning the other 3. This meant that after the round robin tournament the Carnforth year 9 team had won the most games, the most points and had won the entire tournament! Congratulations to the year 9 girls team, your performances were fantastic and you got the results! Well Done. Your certificates will be given out in assembly soon. Lastly commendations are needed for the year 9 and 10 referees who took on the challenge to referee several matches during this tournament. They did this unaided and without adult assistance. They grew in confidence as they refereed each match, and now encompass the skills to referee future futsal tournaments. Well done once again to Lexi (year 9) for exuding confidence and being chosen to independently referee the final match. This was fantastic. Well done to all the girls involved.



## **Girls Netball Tournament**

The year 10 girls netball team had a phenomenal performance at the district netball tournament this week. The entire team played some fantastic netball, adapting quickly to quick back-to-back indoor matches due to the poor weather. The entire squad have put the hours in at training every single week since September; some of them have not missed a single training session. The girls have tirelessly worked on weaknesses and have taken on board feedback from Mrs Sharples and Miss Bird; really working on the skills needed to progress and beat their rivalling teams in the district. They had played all teams in the district during friendly competitions, so knew the expectations for each game going in the district tournament.

They were drawn in pool 1, and therefore played Ripley A and Our Lady's teams in this pool. The result of these games were 5-3 and 3-1 respectively; both in Carnforth's favour. This meant that they won their group stage and therefore played Girls Grammar in the final for 1<sup>st</sup> or 2<sup>nd</sup> place. This was a nail-biting match, as they have rivalled against Girls Grammar for four years, always getting close to victory but never gaining it. The girls knew what was expected and showed determination to have a victorious outcome. There was a slight change up of the team positions, as Lily had to go to perform in the school show, just before the final game. Meaning a switch up of GK, WD and WA was needed. This change in position worked very well and the girls adapted to their new positions with ease. The game was only 8 minutes long, which was a shame as it was thrilling and fast pace from start to finish. There were tense moments from both teams as it was such an even match! Lena and Dolly both defended the goal circle brilliantly making it hard for the opposition.



## **Girls Netball Tournament Continued...**

Some excellent centre court play from Amy, Lily and Holly too which helped to keep the game fast paced. Unfortunately, the game ended with LGGS winning by two goals. Any team could have won this final but unfortunately it was not us this time. The final score was 3-1 to the Girls Grammar, which was a very small defeat in the end and the smallest goal difference that there has been between the two teams throughout the years. Lottie gained player of the match from the final, given to her by the Girls grammar team. Well done Lottie, and well done to the entire team, Mrs Sharples and Miss Bird are extremely proud of your efforts in not only the final and the tournament but your entire season of netball. We hope that you will all continue to play netball into year 11, and continue playing in the Ladies league on a Monday night outside of school. Well done Year 10- 2nd place in the District Tournament is a fantastic result!!

Carnforth High School have been accepted for some funding. We have used some of this funding to get some netball dresses for our teams! The year 10s will be entering the local Lancaster and Morecambe netball league in the summer. The girls will wear these dresses to compete, and we wish them luck as they start playing netball in a competitive adult league outside of school.



## PE Key Messages

Just a reminder to all students regarding changing for PE. You will be required to change into PE kit, for your PE lesson, unless you are in a pot/cast for a fracture or break. The only other exception is if you have a doctors note prohibiting you from changing. There has been various times over the past few weeks where there has been some confusion regarding this. The PE policy is the same as it always has been, please bear this in mind, it is essential for pupils to bring their PE kit for every PE lesson.

For ALL pupils involved in extracurricular PE practices and fixtures, please remember to continually check the fixtures board and team sheet notice boards for upcoming matches. See the captain of your team and tick your name off. This helps tremendously when organising fixtures, especially during busy weeks when there are several matches going on.

## **Sports Transport and Fixture Payments**

The PE department is offering the opportunity for parents to make a one-time payment at the start of the 2023/24 academic year of £25 to cover their child's extra-curricular fixture transport payments. Currently the PE department charges £1 for home fixtures and £2 for away fixtures, this covers a percentage of cost for transport and competition fees, this will remain in place for parents who do not wish to make the £25 one-time payment. We believe that this for some parents will be a preferential method of payment for their child's sporting fixtures throughout the school year.
