



Our Fundraising & Events Club at Carnforth High School hosted a Comic Relief bake off, a throw-wetsponges-at-staff event and a quiz in school to raise money for the Red Nose Day cause. A lot of fun was had by all, with some wonderful bake-off entries and many students taking advantage of the target practice opportunity to soak the brave teachers who volunteered. Some students wanted to spend £5, £10 and even £20 on purchasing sponges to throw – we think it was because of their desire to raise money, rather than any other ulterior motive! We raised just over £125 on the day, a big thanks to the staff and students who supported these events.





Cooking for the Homeless

Our Year 8 students trialled our 'cook for the homeless' last month, making 57 exceptional vegetable curries and rice from scratch! They were all labelled and packaged, and Mrs Rogerson had the pleasure of taking them to Lancaster & District Homeless Action Service (LDHAS) the next day as they were using them for lunch!

LDHAS staff were very grateful for the donations. They provide 3 meals a day for homeless people in the Lancaster and Morecambe area. They have 80 homeless people working with them and on average serve food to 25 adults at a time. 80% of the local homeless are male and the average age is 40. The meals we provide were very gratefully received and we hope to cook for them every half term.

Then, on our second Enrichment Day at the start of March, 150 students took part in our 'big cook' over the five hour day. Students peeled, chopped, cooked, packaged and labelled meals. An amazing 253 meals were created in one day! We provide lunches as when they need them and hope to continue to cook every half term.

Farm Visit

Last Tuesday, Mrs Rowland took the Year 10 and 11 Food Technology students to spend the day learning about milk production and how robotic Dairy Farms work as part of their AQA GCSE course at Lancashire Farm Education Centre. In the morning we learned about the work that went into running a dairy farm and how they use milking robots to create a more productive farm. The afternoon consisted of a scavenger hunt around the farm, butter making, a nature walk looking at the farm's carbon footprint, food miles, and then we had a go with the simulated milking buckets, which proved milking cows by hand is harder than it may look!



PLANS IN PLACE

Maths in Careers

Students in Year 7 considered 'Maths in Careers' as part of one of their lessons this week. Students sometimes think about careers directly linked to Maths in an obvious way (and we did discuss careers in areas such as accountancy) but this task helped them to see how a range of careers, such as a builder, hairdresser, soldier and business owner would also need to use maths as part of their role. Mr McGauran, the Careers Leader, was very impressed with Year 7s wide range of thinking about how maths can benefit them in the future.

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Apprenticeships Support

In the last week of term, we were lucky to have a visit from a Careers Advisor to offer some further support and guidance to fourteen students in Year 11 who are looking to apply for an apprenticeship as their post-16 option for next year. Apprenticeships are jobs, so finding one is often more difficult that applying for a college or Sixth Form place. The students worked with the Careers Advisor to ensure they know where to look for apprenticeships and how to successfully apply.



Year 10 Work Experience

The (extended) deadline for organising Work Experience placements has now passed. Over 90% of our students have now entered their placement details onto Unifrog. Many of these have now been approved.

Our Careers Leader, Mr McGauran, will now look at the details of those that have not yet been approved. Remember: students cannot go out on a placement unless the business has Employers Liability Insurance, a risk assessment and a health and safety policy in place.

Students can see whether their placement has been approved by looking at the Unifrog 'placement tool.' Anything in green is complete and anything in orange is still waiting for completion. If the 'Permission' box is green then the placement has been approved by school and there's nothing else to do but wait until June!

Football – Year 7, 8 and 9

The year 7, 8 and 10 boys football teams played against QES in a set of friendly football fixtures. The 8s played first, travelling to Kirkby Lonsdale for the fixture. The game was played in a great spirit, with two good teams trying to playing attacking football. QES took a two goal lead before Jack finished into the far bottom corner following a superb defence splitting pass from midfielder George.

Unfortunately, due to an injury, the match was abandoned early in the second half. Credit to both sets of players who responded to the situation with fantastic maturity, allowing first aid to take place. The year 7 boys hosted QES, with QES ending up 5-0 winners. Played on a sticky pitch in tough windy conditions the first half was a close game. QES created the stronger chances and led 2-0 at the break. Special mention to centre half Oliver who defended superbly and led the Carnforth team with his communication. QES added three further goals in the second half to win the game 5-0. It was great to see so many year 7 boys involved, with 15 year 7 players representing school at some stage of the game.

The year 10 boys drew 2-2, again a game played in very boggy conditions. Mason and Toby were the scorers of the two Carnforth goals. Credit to Charlie, Jayden and Will for representing QES during the game, as they were short of numbers. This shows a fantastic attitude.



Football – Year 9 and 10 vs. Ripley St Thomas

The year 9 and 10 football teams hosted Ripley in the district football league. The year 9s, who again show fantastic improvement game by game, battled hard to frustrate a strong Ripley side. Ripley took the lead through a very unfortunate penalty on the stroke of half time.

Noah equalised for Carnforth early in the second half, with a glancing header at the front post directing the ball into the far corner. Carnforth continued to frustrate Ripley, with Alex and Steven defending heroically at central defence. Blake, Tom and Kenzie formed a magnificent midfield 3, constantly pressing and winning the ball back. Alfie up top ran his socks off, pressurizing the defenders. Ripley broke the Carnforth resolve mid-way through the second half, before adding 2 more goals to win the game 4-1.



The year 10 boys hosted Ripley on the same evening in a fixture and result that will live long in the memory.

Ripley took the lead early in the game before wide man Toby replied for Carnforth scoring from outside of the box. In the second half central midfielder Harvey gave Carnforth the lead with an outrageous solo goal. Mason played Harvey in with a great through ball before Harvey rode three challenges to smash the ball home from a tight angle.

In the final moments of the game, following a period of excellent defending from the Carnforth players, Ripley were awarded a penalty. The Ripley attacker stepped up only to be denied by the Carnforth goalkeeper low to his right-hand side. James parried the ball away, a goal mouth scramble followed, and the Carnforth defenders cleared the ball away. The final whistle sounded and was greeted by cheers and celebrations by the Carnforth players.

Football – Year 8, 9, 10 and 11 vs. Morecambe Bay Academy

On Monday 25th March and Tuesday 26th March the years 8 to 11 boys football team played against Morecambe Bay Academy.

On the Monday years 9 and 10 travelled to Morecambe. The years 9 won 2-1, producing an excellent team performance on a tough pitch. Carnforth took the lead through Theo who slotted past the goalkeeper when running through one v one.

Carnforth has numerous chances to extend their lead but failed to find the back of the net. Morecambe made the year 9 boys pay mid-way through the second half equalising from a corner.

Carnforth responded well and continued searching for the next goal in the game, Nat found this with a strike into the far top corner to win the game for the year 9s. The year 10 boys slipped to a 2-1 defeat, Mason scored the only Carnforth goal. Carnforth squandered plenty of chances but failed to draw level against a strong Morecambe outfit.



The year 8 boys football team produced another excellent performance in a 4-2 home victory to Morecambe. Kenzie opened the scoring, with a finish from close range. Morecambe equalised on the stroke of half time, with a long-range strike.

Theo scored the goal of the game with a 25-yard half volley beating the goalkeeper at the far post. Theo added a third following a defence splitting ball by winger Jack. Morecambe clawed another goal back, this time of a corner, but Owen put the game to bed with a finish at the back post.

The year 11 football team slipped to a 2-1 defeat in a close, end to end game, that could have gone either way. Both teams had chances to win the game but it was Morecambe who capitalised to win the game. Louis was the Carnforth scorer.
