

GCSEs are Underway!

As you can see from the important dates above, GCSEs start <u>this week</u> for certain subjects. Once we return from the 6th May bank holiday next week, *daily* exams begin.

Students in Year 11 all attended an assembly on Friday where they were informed about all the support they will be receiving once exams begin. At the start of this week, they will receive a full exam timetable, which will also include all the revision available to them. Our current plan of support can be seen on the next page. 
GCSE Student Support

For the rest of this week, we are still in 'Phase 2.' We encourage students to continue to go to as many lunchtime and after school sessions and they feel will benefit them.

The students have their blue rewards cards (which are stamped/signed each time they attend) so that you can see which sessions they have been going to. **On Wednesday this week, Mr McGauran will collect in the reward cards** to assign the awards each student has earned.

Some students have already earned food rewards, online shopping vouchers and money off prom tickets from Phase 1. The overall rewards (like money off prom tickets) will be combined and students will find out what they have earned in our next assembly, which will take place on Friday this week. The reward requirements for Phase 2 are shown on the next page.

Once daily exams begin (from Tuesday 7th May), our plan is that there will be a revision at 3.25pm for any exam that takes place the following morning, and a special revision session during P3 (where students will come out of any lesson) on the day of any afternoon exam. This will be made clear on the timetable that you and your child will receive this week.





CHS Lockdown Procedures

You may have seen the news story last week involving a school in Wales, whereby the school was placed in 'lockdown' for an extended period of time for the safety of students and staff.

Our school has a pre-existing and regularly reviewed 'lockdown procedure.' In light of recent events, we will be reminding all staff and students (via assembly) this week about the procedure. This is to ensure that everyone on site knows how to recognise that a lockdown is underway and what they need to do.

The school's leadership team will also be reviewing the lockdown procedure this week. We carry out 'lockdown drills' on an annual cycle, and this will continue.



FREE Breakfasts for ALL Students and Other Canteen Changes

Since our return from the Easter Break students can now get a Free Breakfast every school day. This can support our students to have a positive start to the day and can focus on achieving their best. Students will be able to choose from a range of cereals, bagels or porridge, as well as fresh fruits. Since the launch, we have served over 100 breakfast items a day, and keeps going up daily.

We are also updating the lunch menu in the canteen. Over the last few months, trials of new options such as protein pots, sub sandwiches and rice pots have proved to be very popular with our students and the aim is to continue to provide this range of options in the future. Alongside this, the hot meals will incorporate more seasonal produce, fresh vegetables and local produce, giving all pupils the chance to enjoy balanced and varied meals throughout the week.



Lessons are for Learning

As a school, we believe that your child's learning and their development as well-rounded, productive human beings is important. We've had a great start to the week and seen a huge improvement already with our focus of ensuring that students spend their lesson time in lesson, where they undertake the learning they need.

In order to support this, please discuss with your child the need to bring a water bottle to school and encourage them to use the time before school, at break and at lunch time to go to the bathroom so that they do not ask to come out of lessons. Pastoral is also open at these time and this is when students need to find people, such as their Year Leader, to speak to staff about illness/issues.

New Outdoor Canopy for Students






Learning from Local Labour Market Information (LMI)

This week's assembly will be on Careers. Our Careers Leader, Mr McGauran, will be talking to the students in all years about careers in our area now and in the future. It's important for students in all year groups to consider what they would like to do in the future, and whether there are employers for that (both now and in the future) where we live. Here you can see who the major local employers are:






Here you can see what are currently **predicted to be the biggest employers in the future in our local area**, Lancaster and Morecambe. Information like this is why we bring visitors to school from employers such as Lancaster University, teacher training providers (like Ripley SCITT) and the NHS:



Here is a reminder that there are a lot of ways for students to get qualified and achieve their best career prospects. At CHS, students study Level 1 and 2 qualifications; a level 2 is a GCSE grade 4 or above, which is **why it's so important to do your best in your GCSEs!** After this level, students have many routes available, including 'academic' routes, like 'A-Level's and 'vocational' routes, like apprenticeships.



Here you can see the evidence that getting higher level qualifications matters to the future of our students! The higher the level of qualification you earn, the more likely you are to be employed in the future:




The evidence also tells us that that **those who have higher qualifications earn more in their lifetimes on average than those with lower qualifications or no qualifications at all**. The good news, as shown on the previous page, is that gaining a level 4, 5 or 6 qualification is not just a matter of going to university – that's not right for everyone – and you can gain these levels through apprenticeships too.



This data shows us that the number of jobs available for people with lower-level qualifications will be declining in Lancaster and Morecambe over the coming years, whereas jobs available for those with higher qualifications will increase:



Skills for work are the most important thing that a student can develop, as new career opportunities are being created all the time; many jobs that our current students will be doing in 20 years don't even exist yet! The National Cyberforce is coming to Lancashire, so jobs in cyber security are one area that we know will be growing in our area in the near future:

Bay struck early in the second half to claw a goal back but Zak slotted in at the far post following a good save from the Bay goalkeeper.

Kenzie scored the final goal of the game, latching onto a Zak cross to head home. A 6-1 victory for the year 8 boys who sealed their place in the district football final, that will take place vs Central Lancaster High School on Friday 26th April.

Year 10 District Football Final

The year 10 boys football team qualified for the district football cup final following a second-place finish in the district league table. Morecambe Bay Academy were the opposition with the final being played at the Giant Axe Stadium, the home of Lancaster City.

Played on a large pitch and during a hot afternoon both teams gave 100%, showing fantastic desire to win the final. The first half was tight and even, with Carnforth defending the Morecambe attack well. The Carnforth defence led by Toby R and Aidan E. When Carnforth goalkeeper James W was called upon he made a few routine saves. Tom C had the best chance of the half, following an excellent through ball by Mason B but the Morecambe goalkeeper saved well to his left hand side.

The second half exploded into life when Mason struck a thunderbolt half volley from 30 yards out, to beat the Morecambe goalkeeper. The ball landed in the top corner. An absolutely incredible strike and goal, worthy of any final in world football.

Carnforth continued to defend bravely, limiting the number of clear cut Morecambe chances until a penalty was awarded with 10 minutes left on the clock. The Morecambe forwarded dispatched from the spot to level up the score line. Carnforth had two glorious chances to win the game but failed to convert before Morecambe clinched the victory in the final minute. A cruel blow and a cruel way to lose any final, between two very even and competitive teams. Well played to Morecambe who battled to the very end. Well played to Carnforth who were a fantastic representation of the school.



Key PE Messages

Just a reminder to all students regarding changing for PE. You will be required to change into PE kit, for your PE lesson, unless you are in a pot/cast for a fracture or break. The only other exception is if you have a doctors note prohibiting you from changing. There has been various times over the past few weeks where there has been some confusion regarding this.
